



## Call for applications for new members of the EUA-CDE Steering Committee

The EUA Council for Doctoral Education (EUA-CDE) is looking to fill two vacant Steering Committee positions.

The EUA-CDE Steering Committee convenes three to four times a year; it prepares and implements the EUA-CDE work programme together with the secretariat and advises on topics of interest and future activities.

The EUA Board has established a Nominations Committee. It will be the responsibility of the Nominations Committee to prepare a shortlist of candidates for consideration by the EUA Board. Steering Committee members will be appointed for a period of three years, once renewable. The Nominations Committee will seek to retain a Steering Committee that is diverse in terms of geography and gender.

New members will begin their mandate in March 2018 with the **first steering committee meeting on 28 March 2018 in Brussels**. Candidates interested in becoming a member of the Steering Committee should fulfil the criteria set out below.

1. Demonstrate a considerable level of expertise and concrete experience concerning institutional management of doctoral education.
2. Be knowledgeable about national and international debates and policies in the area.
3. Have a clear and well informed vision for doctoral education in Europe. This vision should be described in a short statement to be sent with the application.
4. Have a position of institution-wide responsibility in a EUA-CDE member university at the level of vice-rector or similar.

Candidates should send a short CV, cover letter demonstrating the criteria above as well as the motivation to apply, and the short statement on their vision for doctoral education in Europe to Caroline Marissal ([caroline.marissal@eua.be](mailto:caroline.marissal@eua.be)) **at the latest by 30 November 2017**.
